Fr. Kevin's Cluttered Desk

The 50 days of Easter are the prime times to celebrate baptism and 1st Communion. During this period the joy of the Easter Vigil in which new Catholics were joined to the church is lived out over and over through our celebrations of Baptism and 1st Communion. A calling to surrender to God's will in our lives.

One of the great beauties of Baptism is when we experience the fullness of baptism seen in a full immersion. The baptism is a dying to sin and rising again as a new adopted child of God. In the early church it was a re-entering of the womb of life. As the waters of our mothers wombs protected us and sustained us, the waters of baptism give us the special protection that comes from God's grace. Our returning to the womb also signifies a letting go, a humility of surrender to the Father's will. This is more clearly seen in the baptism of an adult but even for the child we experience the letting go through the eyes of the mother and father as they recognize God has entrusted His child to them for its care and upbringing in the faith. This is no longer just their child, this is God's and their child, who will need to be nurtured and cared for as it grows in the faith.

Some of these may even find themselves called to religious life or the priesthood, some may have to experience much discernment to find their way. I equate this to my being asked/ told to step out from the seminary and take some time to ensure the priesthood was my calling. (The short and polite form of my experience.) Stepping out was like returning to the womb, begin again to see/hear God's call and will.

A friend once said, the scariest words one could ever speak were "here I am Lord I come to do your will." Surrender to God in all things and the joy of your heart will be revealed.
