

Fr. Kevin's Cluttered Desk

Being a good Catholic is not easy and being a poor Catholic is not easy. Why? To be a Catholic is to go against the mainstream of society. Let me give you a few examples. We live in a consumer society in which buying more and having more is desired, but Jesus tells us to get rid of material stuff and focus on important things. So have you noticed that if you are not up to date on the latest things people will make fun of you and challenge you to get with it? Jesus calls us to build up the Kingdom and even gives us teachings of how to do that, but are we prepared to live in peace and respect for each other?

Early in my priesthood I was brought into a difficult situation. A couple who had been married for many years and now, fully retired, had decided to divest themselves of much of their wealth. They had paid for their children's education, had set them up in business, and just wanted to simplify their lives. When the children found out that mom and dad were planning on giving away money to charities and the church they were furious. Parents are supposed to leave their wealth to their children, or so the children believed. The dad held the position that he had worked for the wealth that he had accumulated and he had already given much to his children, so he and his wife could and would give "their" money to whomever they wanted. Their son chose to quote Proverbs 13:22 to them. "A good man leaves an inheritance to his children's children." The dad chose Luke 6:38. "Give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For with the measure you give will be the measure you get back." Dad also argued that he was drawing from the words of Jesus which trumped the Prophets. The son came to me looking for scriptural arguments to convince his father to leave the money to the children, especially since the money issue was creating division in the family.

Jesus talks about division in families and how often is money the root of division? Money is a tool. It is also a gift from God. It is there to help but, if it does not help, then maybe we need to get rid of it. Jesus tells his disciples to take no extra tunic, no extra sandals, no money in their purse, but rather trust in God.

I had no answer for the family but I spent much time in prayer for them. I found it very sad to hear what the children valued. For me all the money in the world does not add up to the wisdom my dad shared with us and the love our mother gives to us. One teaching my dad gave us that I did share with the family was this, "If you are waiting for someone else to pay your way, stop waiting and pay your own way, and when you receive a gift, share."

From time to time we need to look at the things that divide our biological families and our faith families and ask are they important and worth the separation? Sadly we are not the early church where the pagans would be heard to say, "See how they love one another". To be Catholic means to be different, to walk against the "norms" of society. Do we truly give back to God in the manner God has given to us?
