## **Fr. Kevin's Cluttered Desk**

What does it take to believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist? Even when Jesus invited and informed the people who had followed him around Israel, that they needed to eat his flesh and drink his blood, they found that hard to take and many walked away. Did Jesus run after them? Did he plead with them to stay? Did he change his teaching? No, Jesus did none of these things, rather he accepted their right to choose to walk away. Jesus responds, "For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted them by my Father." This again is challenging for to whom does the Father grant this privilege? With the death, resurrection and ascension of the Lord this privilege is granted to all of us. Jesus' final direction from the Gospel of Matthew to go out and teach "all" nations and baptize in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, shows us and reminds us that all are called and all are granted the privilege of coming to the Son, but God does not make us do so. He grants us a privilege, an invitation, a gift. How we respond is still up to us, for we must choose to receive and, in essence, choose to believe.

There are many things in life that we are shown, that we are told but at the end of the day do we accept them or not? For example, we have all been told that smoking is bad for us but still many people choose to smoke. We have been told that taking drugs, illegal and legal drugs, can harm us but many still take them. We know that Jesus walked on this earth but many choose not to believe this. We know that we are made up of DNA but how many of us have seen it or understand it?

Each of us has the gift of freewill, the ability to choose. We choose what we like, we choose what we want and frequently we choose what we want to believe. We also have the ability to choose to follow Jesus and strive to do God's will. I can choose to listen and believe the words of Jesus and so I choose. *As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.* "What does it take to believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist?" It takes choosing, everyday of your life, to listen and embrace the words of Jesus. "Unless you eat the Flesh of the Son of Man and drink His Blood, you have no life in you."
