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Within the **Catholic** Church there are two **types** of Deacons. **First** there are **permanent** deacons, **generally** who are **married**, they have **secular jobs** to support their **families**. They **also help** the local pastor by **visiting** the **sick**, **teaching** the **faith** (**RCIA** or **Sacramental Preparation**), **grief counselling**, **preparing** couples for **marriage**, working on **parish committees** and councils, and **giving advice** to the **pastor**. **Transitional** deacons are **seminarians**, **students** in the **last phase** of **training** for the Catholic **priesthood**. Generally **after** being a deacon for a **year**, they are **ordained** a priest by the **bishop**. A deacon, either permanent or transitional, is a **servant-leader** who ministers to the **physical needs** of church **members**. As ministers of the Church they are called to **functions** of Word, Sacrament, and Charity. As ministers of **Word**, deacons **preach** and teach in the **name** of the Church and **proclaim** the **Gospel**. As **ministers** of Sacraments a deacon can perform **baptisms**


and **officiate** at **weddings** and **funeral** vigils and funeral **services** **outside** the mass. As ministers of **Charity** a deacon can be seen **working** in **prison** ministry, **hospital** ministry, **soup kitchens**, **food banks**, or **homeless** shelters. The most **visible** **role** of deacons in the Catholic Church is their **liturgical** role at **Mass**, still this is only a very small part of a deacon's ministry. **Most** **deacons** are assigned **other** ministries and **may** **even** be called **upon** by their local Bishop to **assist** in **Diocesan** functions and **councils**. A deacon must have been **baptized** in the **Roman** Catholic Church, he must be at **least** 35 years old and he must be a **practicing** Catholic. If he was baptized as an **adult** then he must have belonged to the **church** for at least five years **prior** to **being** ordained.



## Fr. Kevin's Cluttered Desk

Forgiving one another as God in Christ has forgiven you. Not as easy as it sounds. But in our faith, we have a wonderful witness to how it could/should work. In a marriage there are four foundation stones to build a marriage upon. The first three are fairly simple and easy to understand, they are: faith, hope and love. But the fourth, that is the hard one. Forgiveness, the ability to say I am sorry, the ability to say I forgive you, that can be very hard, but it finds its strength in the first three. On a couple's wedding day they are filled with love for each other but it is a love that has to grow; it's not a fully mature love, that generally only comes with 50 or 60 years of marriage. They have hopes and dreams in each other and with each other, but these can change and sometimes need to be adapted. And then there is their faith in each other. This is a faith filled with trust, filled with honor for the other person, for on their wedding day in front of family and friends they promised to love and honor each other all the days of their lives. What is honor? Honor is putting away all bitterness, anger, wrangling, slander, and any form of malice towards the other. Honor is profound tenderness, gentleness, harmony and trust in the other. When the husband loves the wife and the wife loves the husband God is made present in the world and God is love and God is compassionate and God is forgiving. In the marriage, the couple puts on Christ, and they become living witnesses of Christ in the world as they become more and more Christ-like. Growing up we were told that couples who prayed together stayed together. So being the person I am I asked a couple who had been married 60 years, what the prayer was that they prayed together that kept them together. You should know the answer. They prayed the Mass together, they shared Jesus together so that they might be Jesus to others.
