In March 2024, Canada's euthanasia ("MAiD") law is scheduled to expand to allow euthanasia for mental illness alone.

The Euthanasia Prevention Coalition has supplied postcards for parishioners to sign and mail to **Rachel Thomas** our Member of Parliament for Lethbridge, no postage is necessary.

The postcards ask the government to reverse its decision to permit "MAiD" for persons suffering with mental illness; to provide advocacy and resources that support healing and resilience,

specifically for those who are struggling with mental illness.

Well, 10 days to Lent. Are we ready, have you put together a plan? In the gospels there are constant references to how Jesus was in the Synagogue on the Sabbath in prayer but there are also many references including in todays Gospel, where Jesus went off by himself in the early morning to pray. Now that sounds like a Lenten plan. Get up early and spend some time in prayer. Yes, our entire day is supposed to be a prayer and yes, we are supposed to pray with the community on Sunday, but those quiet moments with Jesus, those intimate encounters with God are so very important in our lives. Now I am not talking about getting up to pray the Rosary or the Divine Mercy Chaplet[KZ1], both of which are fine devotions, I am talking about just talking with God.

Something like:

and by our baptism made us, priests, prophets, and kings so as to do your will here on earth and finally to serve you Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.
