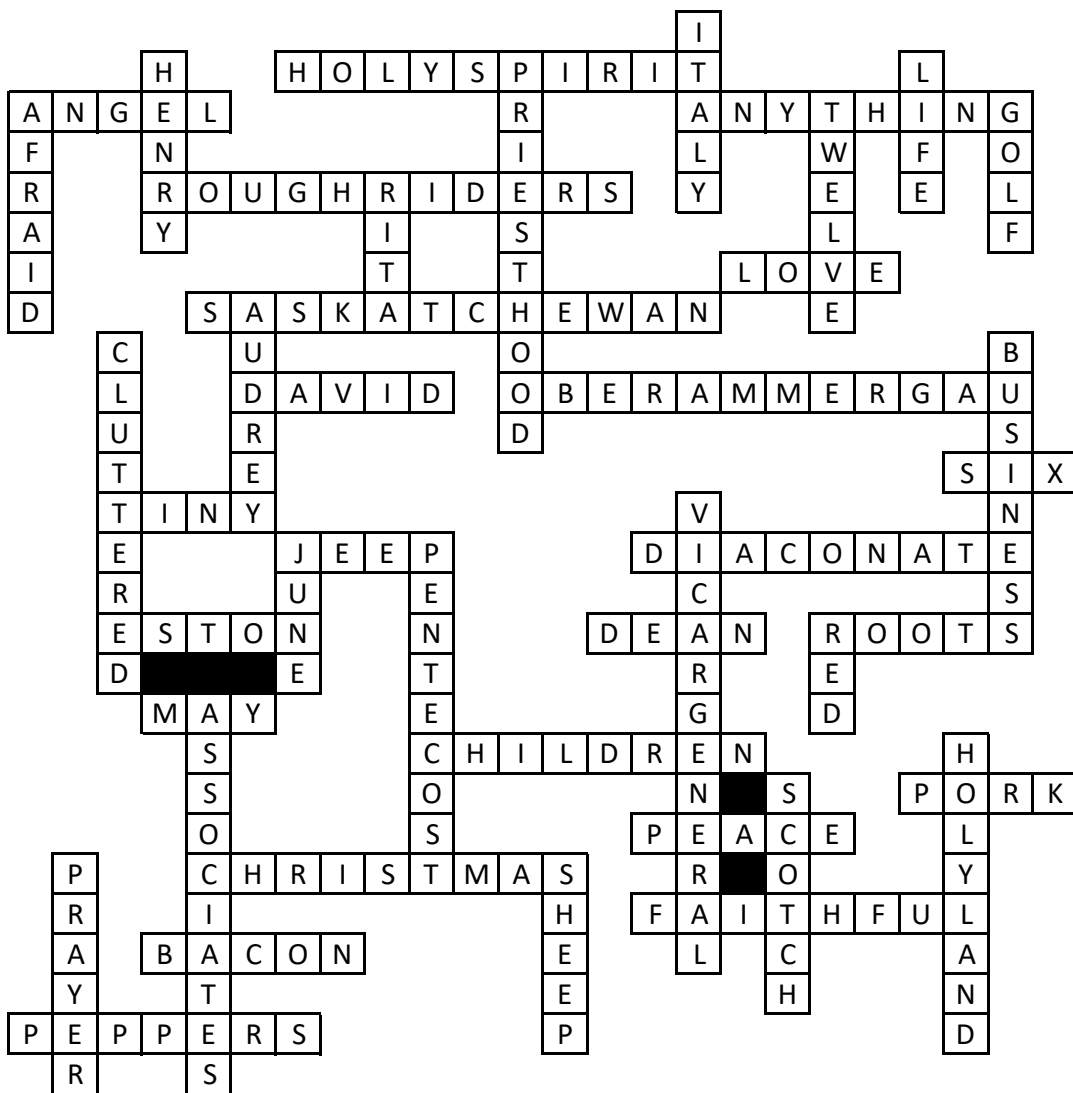

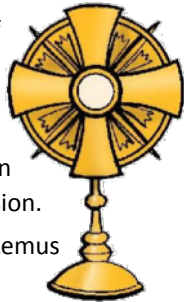

"What deeds of power are being done by His hands!" As a child I was fascinated by the miracles that we heard about in the scriptures. But then again, I was also fascinated by the superheroes of the day. Superman and Batman and how they could fight off evil and help the poor people. The challenge was fact and fantasy. The other factor was do we put our faith in the miracles or are the miracles more of a challenge to our faith than something that builds it up? Reading the comics about Batman and Superman, most knew it was not real but every now and then you run into people who talk like they did believe in superheroes and then you run into other people who will not believe in anything that they cannot see or experience. In His hometown Jesus was not accepted, everyone doubted and wondered how He could perform these deeds, He was just one of them, how could He be able to do these things?

I have two friends in my life that stand out as being "superheroes", one was a surgeon the other an IT person. The surgeon was interesting, he was highly respected but if you looked at his fingers you would notice they were really short, and I must admit wondering how he was able to do what he did with those short little fingers, but he did amazing work. The IT person would be classified as autistic by most people but he is the most amazing person with computers and computer software. Why do I call them superheroes? Because their skill and talents are amazing, and they are able to do all kinds of things I would never think or be able to do and that might go for all of us. Also, in my mind they did not always get the full acceptance and acknowledgement they deserved for their skills, kind of like Jesus in His hometown. Not sure if it was jealousy, or envy, or just a lack of understanding that did not allow people to see their true giftedness. Some people did, but many were like the people in the gospel, who questioned where Jesus got His gifts from.

Sometimes when we take a look, an honest look at our friends we many find superheroes all around us, using their gifts and talents to the best of their abilities but are we celebrating with them, are we acknowledging their gifts and encouraging them? During this pandemic we have celebrated many of our frontline workers, and many of them are our superheroes of today, but do we acknowledge them as such and as this pandemic seems to be winding down will we continue to remember them, or will we just slowly forget how important they are in our lives?
