

Take, and eat

Upcoming Young Adults Event



Fr. Kevin's Cluttered Desk

Today we celebrate the Feast of "The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ" also known as Corpus Christi Sunday. As Catholics the Eucharist is the Source and Summit of our faith. To receive the Eucharist in the Catholic Church is to make a public declaration of your membership in the Catholic Church. Receiving is also a public declaration of your need for Jesus in your life; that you recognize that none of us can do this on our own but that we all need God in our lives. In the Eucharist Jesus becomes fully one with us and empowers the spirit within us to complete our tasks on earth, primarily the building of God's kingdom in the midst of a secular and unjust world. In Confirmation we all receive the fullness of the Holy Spirit but then when will we open ourselves up to that gift and take it and use it to the best of our ability. The Eucharist is what brings that flame alive in our hearts and empowers us to fully embrace the gifts.

St. Paul in the years 53-55 was writing to the Corinthians while he was in Ephesus and part of his purpose was a reminder of the importance of the Eucharist in the life of the people, their need to be fired up and stay fired up for Jesus. We can look at the letter and focus on the "remembrance" or we can focus on the "covenant" in His Body and His Blood. For the Corinthians receiving was not a weekly happening, it only happened when an Apostle or Presbyter was in town, making it a very important moment in the life of the community. They were being reminded of that importance of "the fire of God's love" found in the reception of the Eucharist.

For us today we may want to reflect on that fire of God's love in our lives and look deeply inside ourselves and ask the question "am I fully open to the fire of God's love" and if not, how might I become more open? As were the people of Corinth, we also are on a journey. We need reminders, we need to reflect, and we need guidance. Let us be open to receiving all and everything God sends our way.
