SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

A very sincere thank you for your prayers and financial support, from clients and volunteers of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul.

The Society's mission is to minister to the homeless and the economically disadvantaged through home visits, assistance with shelter, delivery of donated furniture, and help with transportation costs. The Society provides compassion and support to individuals in need, regardless of race, origin, religion or gender, assisting underprivileged in their struggle against poverty.

The 2021 year and the effect of COVID-19 continued to be a challenge for many individuals and families. In 2021, a total of \$56,313 was paid (2020 - \$49,769) for help toward rent (26%), utilities (56%), and other support (18% - delivery of donated furniture, emergency shelter, transportation and medical needs, etc.). Collections were down by about 11% compared to 2020 (down 32% compared to 2019). Overall, approximately \$6,800 more assistance was provided than donations received for the year.



The Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary

June 25, 2022

Beginning in the **Middle Ages**, the devotion to Our Lady's **purity** of heart **began**, **culminating** in St. **John Eudes** **actively promoting** the devotion in the 17th century alongside that of the Sacred Heart of **Jesus**.

Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of **Mary** **rose** to a **new** level after the apparitions of Our Lady of **Fatima**.

At Fatima, Our Lady **asked** for **Russia** to be **consecrated** to her Immaculate Heart in order to **prevent** many calamities from occurring in the **Church** and **throughout** the world. **Lucia** **describes** the **vision**: "As Our Lady **spoke** these **last words**, she opened her **hands** and for the **second time**, she **communicated** to us the **rays** of that same **immense** light. We saw ourselves in this **light**, as it were, **immersed** in God. ... In front of the **palm** of Our **Lady's** right hand was a heart **encircled** by **thorns** which **pierced** it. We **understood** that this was the Immaculate Heart of Mary, **outraged** by the **sins** of **humanity**, and **seeking** reparation."

Our Lady also revealed her **request** for the faithful to make Communions of **Reparation** to her Immaculate Heart on **five** consecutive first Saturdays of the month. Therefore

devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary is **closely associated** with **acts** of reparation for sins in **order** to obtain the **salvation** of **sinners**.

After the **apparitions** of Our Lady of Fatima, the feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary was **instituted** for the **universal** Church by **Pope Pius XII** in 1944. The feast was **originally** celebrated on **August 22nd**, the **octave** day of the Solemnity of the Assumption. It was later moved to the Saturday following the feast of the **Sacred** Heart of Jesus, so that the Two Hearts would **appear** side-by-side on the **liturgical calendar**. August 22nd was then made the feast of the **Queenship** of the **Blessed Virgin** Mary, connecting the Assumption to her **reign** in **heaven** (the 4th and 5th Glorious **Mysteries** of the Holy **Rosary**).

Today, **while** the feast of the **Most Sacred** Heart of Jesus is a **Solemnity**, the feast of the **Immaculate** Heart of Mary **remains** on the **level** of a memorial. **Hopefully**, as the requests of Our Lady of Fatima are more **widely heeded**, the Immaculate Heart of Mary **will** enjoy a **special** place in the heart of each and **every Catholic** around the **world**. Our Lady of Fatima, **pray** for us!

Well, the major celebrations are behind us, and we are now fully into the "Ordinary Season" of our year. Our vestments now stay mostly green for a long stretch. The readings will begin to focus on the daily grind of our faith and the work of being a good evangelist. By our baptism we are all called to spread the "Good News" of Jesus Christ but sadly not everyone wants to hear or listen to Jesus and what Jesus has to say. We can be too busy or often times we don't like what we hear and how it makes us feel. Our faith is not supposed to make us feel comfortable and if it does then it is not doing what it is supposed to do. The journey of faith is a hard and narrow road, the easy road as we all know is the road paved to hell. The easy road is not our road. But walking that road with Jesus is a struggle, especially when we are faced with having to explain or defend what it is that we believe in, or even just loving our neighbour.

In Paul's letter to the Galatians, Paul talks about biting and devouring each other, another image for gossip. Have you ever noticed how gossip consumes our time, takes pieces out of others, how gossip tears down? I am not sure which of the ladies around my mother's table made the comment, but it always stuck with me, "When you gossip with one person about another person, you are giving he first person permission to gossip about you." If they will gossip about others *with* you, who will they gossip with *about* you. Gossip kills relationships and most days we have no idea how much harm is being done by our words. St. Paul's image of taking bites out of the other is so true, we bite away at reputation, at character and often times at the truth. Ordinary time is a time of work, so let us work to build up and not break down, to say only the good things and put behind us the bad.
