### Are you sleeping?

The story of Jairus' daughter reminds us that we all face the "sleep" of death due to sin. Jairus' daughter was dying, just as each day that we live in sin, our faith dies a bit more. But Jesus didn't accept the girl's "death" just as He won't accept ours. He reached out, taking her by the hand and

saying, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" And immediately she arose and began to walk. That same hand is outstretched to us every day. His Command, "Arise" echoes in our hearts, calling us back to a pure life from the sleepy sin we so easily fall into. Where are you today? Sleeping? Reaching? Or standing on your feet, your hand in His, ready for the next step?

# Eucharistic Adoration




Every Tuesday we will have outdoor Eucharistic Adoration at Assumption from **8:00 to 11:00pm**

## Fr. Kevin's Cluttered Desk

The story of the hemorrhagic woman is another of the stories that always brings a smile to my face. Jesus was the first superhero, for he had special powers, he was “aware the power had gone forth from Him.” And Jesus had a cloak, not far removed from a cape, and all the woman had to do was touch the cloak and she would be healed. And then there is the World Youth Day hymn “Receive the Power” with the words, you will receive power from the Holy Spirit. Not only is Jesus powerful but so are each of us, but do we have the faith of the hemorrhagic woman? Many superheroes have a sidekick, a partner, well Jesus had 12 of them and each of them had powers, but all of them pointed back to Jesus for their power. Every superhero has an enemy, so does Jesus. The enemies of Jesus also have followers, people willing to do the dirty work. But Jesus also has us, and Jesus gives us the power to fight this evil, it is called the Eucharist. We have received the power of the Holy Spirit and we get recharged each time we receive the Eucharist. We get a battery flush when we go to confession, so we can store up more power and the power will last longer within us. Jesus did not fly, that we know of, but He did walk on water. Jesus did not heal His own wounds but He did bring back people from the dead, heal broken arms, withered legs, cured the blind. Jesus had the selflessness of a superhero for the other people came first. Or maybe it's just that all superheroes are copies of Jesus. Maybe all little children running around wanting to be superheroes are just “a little Jesus” looking for an outlet for the need to heal, the need to help, the need to protect the other.

Yes, I had a fantastic imagination as a younger person, actually I think my imagination still is pretty good, just a bit more refined these days. If you reread the Gospel from today, Mark 5:21-43, who would you be in the story? Jairus, the hemorrhagic woman, the little girl, the disbelievers, the disciples, who do you resonate with? And you might ask yourself, why?
