



Fr. Kevin's Cluttered Desk

Jesus reminds us that He will be with us always and I often wonder if we take this promise for granted or do we just not think about it some days. Before He died Jesus sat down and shared a meal with His disciples, a very special meal that tends to confuse many. When Jesus said, "Do this in memory of me" He was not so much talking about the meal as He was talking about consuming His body and His blood. It is kind of like the people who have pictures of family or friends hanging in the house and walk by them every day but don't really see them anymore. The reminder is still there but do we take the time to look and reflect upon the memory or the reason we chose that picture to put up on the wall. When we stop to reflect, a whole host of memories can come flooding back, even to the point of remembering smells or emotions.

"Do this in memory of me" invites us to constantly remember, to not lose sight of the real meaning or the real presence of Jesus in our lives. In the Eucharist Jesus is truly and completely present to us. His body, His blood His entire divinity is present to us, but the challenge for us is to be truly present to Him. Are we one with Him as He is one with us? Are we one with Him as He is one with His Father?

As a young man there were many times when I was really glad my Dad was not around to see what I had just done, or had not done as well as I should/could have. Disappointing my Dad was always a real downer. I must admit at that point in my life thinking about or reflecting upon the fact that God sees everything, even what I don't want my Dad to see, was not in the cards. But as I reflected more on the Eucharist, and the fact that in receiving Jesus in the Eucharist, I was also inviting Him completely into my life – that's when I started reflecting on the fact that God does see and hear everything and there were changes to be made in my life. At the same time reflecting on the number of times my Dad had forgiven me made we reflect on God's forgiveness and the gift of freewill. Freewill means we make choices and they do not always please God. We can be foolish, stubborn and sometimes very defiant. In all of this God is there offering us an alternative and an invitation to join our lives more closely to His. Do we accept this invitation?

A friend of mine once compared the bowing of our heads before we received the Eucharist to the lowering of one's eyes when they had to say "I am sorry", the offering of humility and the desire to reconnect the relationship with the other. We say "we are not worthy" just before we receive Jesus and the truth is, we are not and never will be, but His desire to be one with us is still there regardless of our unworthiness. The desire of Jesus is that we be one with Him as He is one with the Father and does not have an exclusion element to it. God's love is greater than all our faults and failings, for His love is never ending and perfect.

Let us thank God for the gift of the Eucharist, the gift that was offered to us to unite ourselves more closely to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
