

## Fr. Kevin's Cluttered Desk

The Feast of Corpus Christi is one of my favourite feasts and days in the Liturgical year. Why? Because the focus is totally on the Body and Blood of Jesus. I have mentioned before the video, "The Veil Removed" and how it depicts the joining of the Heavenly Banquet and the Earthly banquet together. It gives us an understanding of the Communion of Saints that gathers at every Mass and how the Eucharist joins us together and makes us one in the celebration and outside the celebration.

I was 10 when Gramma Tumbback passed away. Gramma was special (Gramma knew I did not like cabbage rolls so she would separate the cabbage rolls for me, meat in one pile, rice in another, cabbage on the side with tomato juice. Gramma loved me the best). After Gramma passed away and I would be serving at the altar, I would look out (not that we were supposed to be looking at the people) and I would miss seeing her in "her" pew. My uncle one day noticed me looking out into the congregation and after Mass wanted to know what I was up to and why I was not paying attention during the Mass, especially as I was serving at the altar. I told him I was kind of looking for Gramma. I am not sure what response I was expecting from my uncle but the response I got was not what I was expecting. My uncle told me, Gramma does not sit in the pews anymore, now she floats above the altar with all the saints and angels looking down to make sure young boys are serving their best at the altar. I think the last part was to make me feel guilty but what stuck was Gramma floating above the altar. We all knew that Gramma, from time to time, had needed to go and wake Father up to come celebrate the Mass, so the image of Gramma looking down on the priest was just perfect.

The Eucharist is what brings us all together. It unites us in a very special way, both the living and the dead. The Eucharist is this most powerful gift from God and I must admit that I just don't understand people who, when offered the Eucharist don't come for it. Why would anyone say "no" to God's gift of the Body and Blood of His Son?

As we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi let us all strive to love each other the way Jesus loves us.
