Fr. Kevin's Cluttered Desk

Today throughout the world the First Scrutiny will take place in many of our parishes. What is First Scrutiny? Well, it is part of the journey that someone unbaptized and wanting to be received into the Catholic Church goes through. There are three Scrutinies in total. During the Scrutinies the person is prayed over to ask that they be released from everything that separates them or keeps them separated from Jesus. At the same time, they are prayed over for the strengthening of everything that draws them closer to Jesus. The Scrutinies are generally done in front of the parish community who are invited to pray for those on the journey to becoming Catholic. There is an interesting twofold purpose to this: 1st the witness to the community. Often, we as Catholics take our faith and Church for granted. We forget the blessings we have and how gifted we are as believers in Jesus Christ and His church. 2nd the people's need for prayer and protection. As the old saying goes "the devil does not care about the lukewarm and the cold, they are already in his basket, but those who are on fire for Jesus, they will have the devil's full attention" and so we pray for them. Every year thousands of people join the Catholic Church, and every year people leave the Catholic Church. People are searching. We all should be searching for that deeper relationship with Jesus, but what exactly are we looking for, and do we know what we are or should be looking for? Many people claim their main reason for joining the Catholic Church is Jesus in the Eucharist and for over 2000 years the Church has professed and taught the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. St. Paul teaches in 1 Corinthians 10:16-21 when we partake of the Eucharist, we are actually partaking of the body and blood of Jesus. He writes, "The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not a participation in the Blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not a participation in the Body of Christ?" I don't know about you, but I find arguing with Jesus or St. Paul just makes me look bad. So let us pray for those seeking that deeper relationship with Jesus and let us also strive to help them along the way.
