Sunday Reflection

Listen for his voice

The beloved image of a Good Shepherd is based on the commonly known practice in Jesus time of sheep being kept in communal folds. Each shepherd would go to the fold to lead his sheep to pasture. Only shepherds known to the keeper of the fold would have access. Then only those sheep which recognized the unique melodic way their shepherd pronounced their names would obey the command to go to pasture. The relationship between sheep and shepherd was an intimate one that kept sheep safe.

What a powerful description of a Christian's relationship to God. How intimately we are known to our Creator as He stands at the gate and calls. With what love He sings out our names, our hearts vibrating in harmony, echoing back His name and His love. What a beautiful truth encompassed in such simple words. "My sheep hear my voice; I know them and they follow me." May each of us find time this week to listen for our Shepherd's voice, that we may be led safely into pasture at His side.

Fr. Kevin's Cluttered Desk

Growing up on the farm had a number of very good benefits, one of which is being able to connect with the readings in the Bible. Jesus used farm images and farm ideas to get his point across and sometimes this seems lost on those who have not experienced farm life.

In the Gospel of John Jesus talks about the idea that God does not want to loose any of the sheep, us. God's desire is that all are saved. This teaching was brought home for me when I was about 10. We had some calfs with the cows and one of the calfs had gotten out of the pasture. It seems he crawled under the fence. We discovered his absence when we heard the cows calling out to the little calf. There he was jumping around in the new grown wheat field and having a great time! The young wheat was tender and I am sure very tasty. The cows kept calling to him, wanting him to return but he ignored them and kept wandering farther away. My brother and I tried guiding him back but the more we tried the more we failed. By this time he was getting close to the road. As the young calf was jumping around in the ditch beside the road a neighbour came by in their 3 ton truck. I think he saw our dilemma for he slowed down, but as he drove by the calf he blew the horn on the truck. The young calf jumped and was back in the pasture in an instant. Dad explained that in our lives we wander but please God, we don't have to be scared to death for us to return to the pasture, to stay with the herd.

Within the pasture there are places to explore and challenges to face. Outside the pasture things may look great and things may appeal to us, but in the pasture is where we are safe. Outside the pasture there is great danger, especially when we don't recognize it or acknowledge it. This simple experience in my life has come back to me many times when faced with choices. There are many things in life I have not done, they were outside my pasture. Did some look like a good idea? Yes they did, but just because it is out there does not mean I need to try it. If everyone else is doing it that does not mean I need to. On the other hand, if Jesus would have done it, then I might.
