World Missions





Happy Thanksgiving! This weekend we celebrate thanksgiving which in many ways is a totally Christian way of looking at life. Jesus constantly reminds us to be thankful in all things. St. Paul reminds us to clothe ourselves in love, to celebrate each other, to be thankful. Of the 10 lepers who were healed in the Gospel story, only 1 returned to say thank you. So what is with that?

I was once told by a Sociologist that one of the reasons people don't say thank you is because they take too many things for granted. We are not thankful for fresh water, we are not thankful for our lives, for our jobs. It is too easy to find fault or complain rather than to be thankful and rejoice.
