



Fr. Kevin's Cluttered Desk

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul and with all your mind."

I was reading an article this past week that put a whole new perspective on this passage from scripture. The question was placed as to why, why should we love God above all things? The answer is that God loves us with all His heart and all His soul and all His mind. And how do we know this? Because Jesus laid down His life for us and He suffered and died for us, not because He had to but because He wanted to set us an example to live up to. "I set you an example so you might do what I have done." The love that Jesus had/has for His "Abba" was/is so complete, so immense and this is what we are called to. We are called to respond to a parent's love, a love that is so complete and so overwhelming that it includes the complete forgiveness of sins and the pain that comes from our sinning.

One might ask the question, "Do you know the Father's love?" I am not sure how many of us really do know the Father's love. We might talk about it or reflect on it but at the end of the day do we really know the Father's love? For myself I tend to turn this around and ask myself, how long did it take me to realize my own father's love for me? How often did I take it for granted and how long was I not even aware of his love for me? There was a roof over my head, food on the table and clothes in the drawers, my needs were met, I was loved. It has only been in the last 30 years that I have grown in a greater understanding of my father and why he did what he did and how choices he made made me a better person.

In the same way coming to know our Father in heaven is a similar journey. In my case being old enough and having experienced some of what life offers allowed me to understand my dad and I must admit as I grew to understand my dad I began to understand God even more. Parental love is an expression of the Father's love for us and is supposed to help us grow in love for God. The love of friendship helps us understand Jesus and helps that relationship grow in love. In essence family is the foundation of our lives, it is what God has created to teach us and show us God's love for us.

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul and with all your mind." Why, because that is how God loves us, with His whole being.
